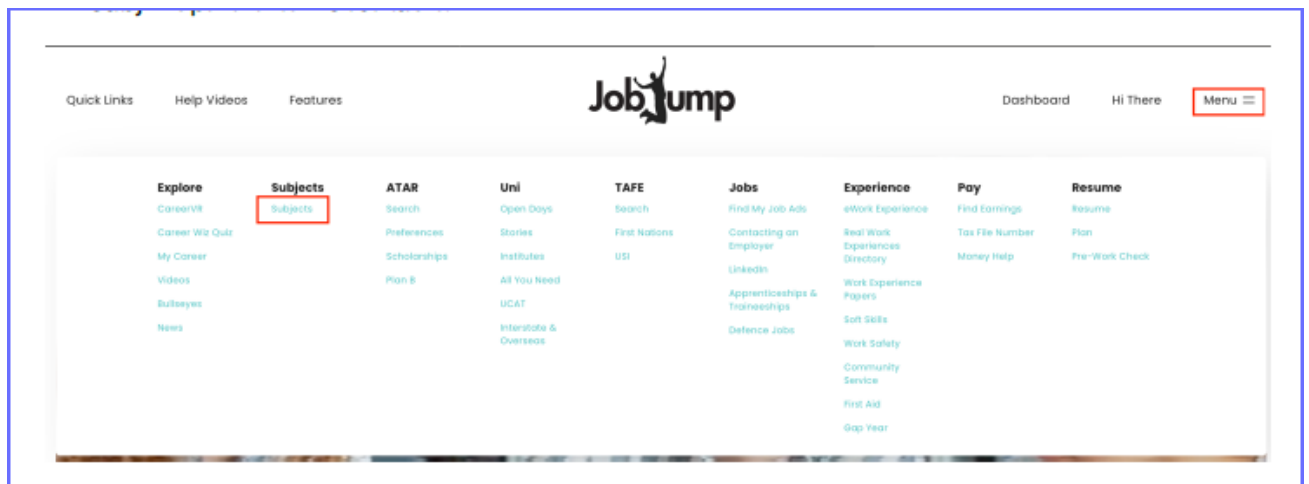

5. Press the *Show Senior Subjects* option (in the red box below).

6. Underneath each course listing there is the HSC Subject information you need.

Subject Selection Requirements

You need to select at least 12 units when going into Year 11.

English is compulsory and worth 2 units of study.

With the remaining 10 units, consider what your school offers.

You may need to also think about having back up subjects just in case your school does not have the ability to run all the subjects you want to study. This sometimes happens because of too few students to form a class or clashes (two subjects you want to do running at the same time on the timetable).

You may also want to think about wanting to receive an ATAR.

All these things should be discussed with your Careers Adviser, parents, the teachers who teach the subjects you like and senior students who study the HSC subjects you like.

You could even look at the course description for the subjects you like in your school's Senior Subject Selection Handbook and even view the topics listed to be taught for these subjects.

ATAR eligibility and calculation

To be eligible for an ATAR in NSW, you must satisfactorily complete at least 10 units of HSC courses.

These courses must include at least:

- 10 units of Board Developed courses
- 2 units of English
- three Board Developed courses of 2 units or greater
- four subject areas.

Your ATAR is then calculated from your:

- best 2 units of English
- best 8 units from your remaining units.

What subjects do or don't count towards an ATAR?

There are two main types of HSC courses: Board Developed Courses and Board Endorsed Courses. Board Developed Courses. Your achievement in these can count towards your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR).

Board Endorsed Courses are generally developed by schools, TAFEs or universities. They contribute to the HSC, but don't count towards your ATAR.

When selecting your subjects remember you will need to do your best over two years.

You should pick subjects that meet these objectives:

- Your interests and your future career.
- Courses in which you have an aptitude.
- Courses to give you a good understanding and foundation to succeed in tertiary studies.
- Don't select courses because of scaling or perceived ATAR as you could be disappointed.

Subject Requirements for University Courses

Prerequisites. These are HSC courses you must have studied before a uni will offer you a place in their course.

Assumed knowledge. These are HSC courses the uni assumes you have studied before you start the uni course. Not a requirement for entry, but without the assumed knowledge you may have difficulties coping with your Uni studies.

Recommended studies. These are HSC courses the uni suggests will prepare you for core first year uni courses. Not a requirement for entry.

What if I haven't chosen the right assumed or recommended HSC subjects for the university course I wish to study?

You can still get an offer to most institutions. It is important to check for any pre-requisite HSC subjects. In the case of Assumed Knowledge HSC subjects, you may need to catch up on background knowledge through:

- bridging courses. (These are offered at most Universities. If this applies to you, ask the Uni when you go to their Open Days or simply call them).
- extra subjects within the Uni course structure.

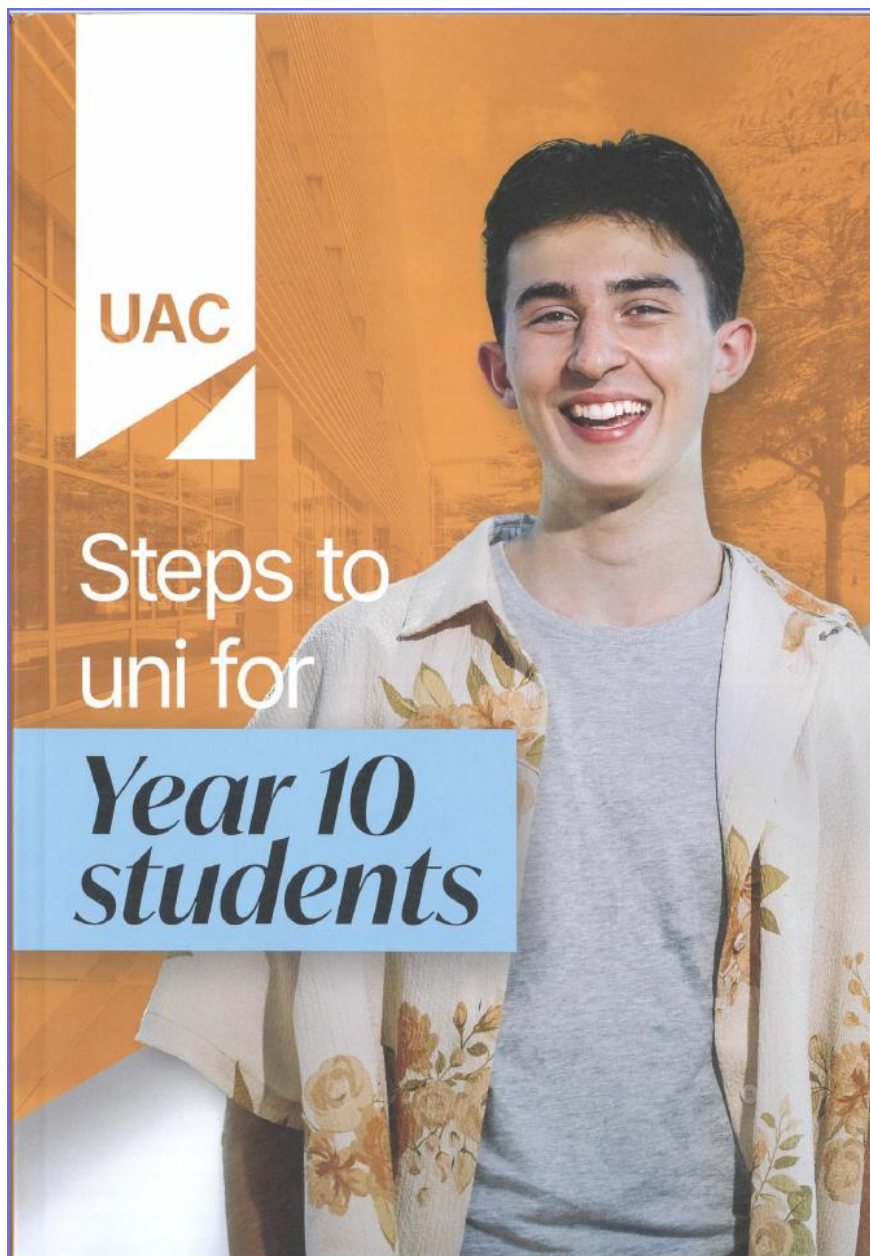
NOTE: If you don't as yet have a Job Jump account, it is free for students and their parents... use the password "finches" when registering and then make up your own password with creating your account.

UPCOMING YEAR 10 INFORMATION EVENING – 10 JUNE, 7:30 PM IN THE MPC

There is an upcoming information evening to be held in the MPC on Tuesday 10th June at 7:30 pm to provide Year 10 students and their parents with information about subject selection for Year 11 and 12. Information will be provided about HSC and ATAR requirements and the process of nominating preferences for Year 11 subjects for next year.

Subject displays will be available along with opportunities to talk with teachers about the content of various Year 11 and 12 subjects. Students do not choose their subjects on this night but rather receive information about the HSC and the process involved to nominate their subject preferences for next year.

A University of Newcastle speaker will talk to Year 10 at their Year Meeting on 6 June about subject selection with respect to possible further study after school. A University of Newcastle representative and a TAFE TVET representative have been requested to be present at the information night to answer questions from students and parents. Students will also receive a booklet (pictured below) from the Universities Admission Centre (UAC) in an upcoming Year Meeting about preparations for tertiary study with respect to subject selection.

Mann St, Gosford Program Updates

Construction of our new building in Mann Street Gosford will be completed this year and will be ready to welcome students from Semester One, 2026.

We can now announce the first stage of program offerings for this new facility. The programs will have a strong focus on humanities, education and Pathway programs and it will be a great opportunity for staff and students to teach and study in a new, purpose-built facility that connects us to our community and industry partners.

Our Mann St site is the University's largest investment since we built NUspace in Newcastle CBD. Alongside our Ourimbah site and the Central Coast Clinical School and Research Institute, the new building will increase our presence in the Gosford CBD and strengthen our commitment to the Central Coast.

The location of the new building is a key benefit – it will place our students and staff in the heart of Gosford, close to public transport, work opportunities and services, which will improve student experience and encourage more people on the Central Coast to study at university.

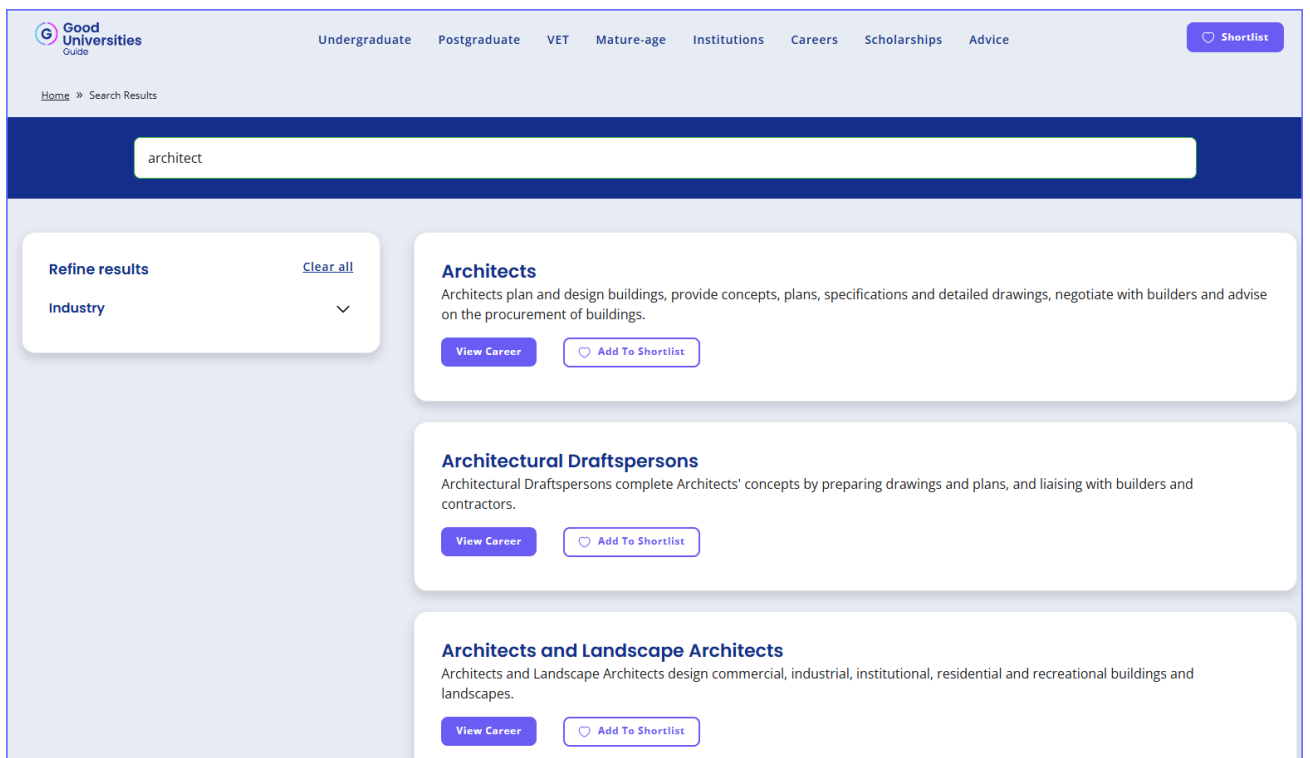
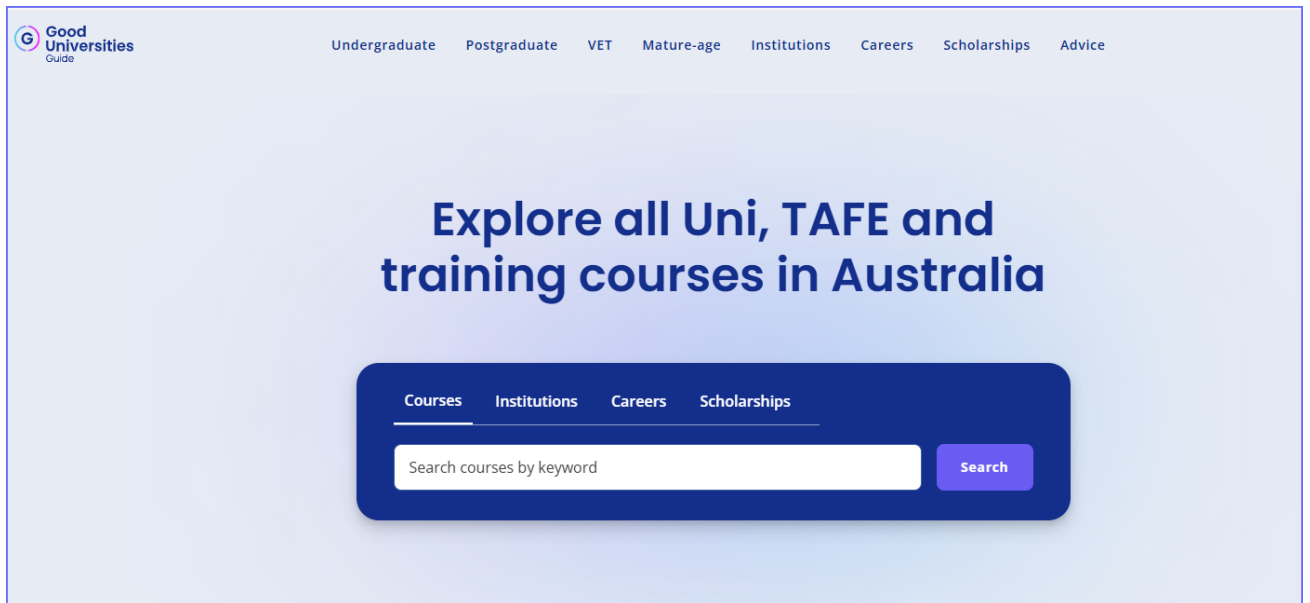

Medicine UCAT Applicants: dates for your diary

Application and offer dates for semester 1, 2026 have been provided by the universities and are set out on our [medicine key dates page](#). Check with each university to confirm deadlines and requirements and to ask any questions you have about the selection process.

Entry into undergraduate medicine degrees is highly competitive. Take the following steps to make sure your application is considered.

- Register for the Undergraduate Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT). Important dates are coming up:
- Booking deadline – 16 May 2025
- Final late booking deadline (late fee applies) – 6 June 2025
- Testing begins – 1 July 2025
- Complete your UAC application by 11.59pm 30 September 2025 – the application processing fee increases after this date.
- Apply directly to each university's medicine faculty (most require this). Address any extra requirements specified by each uni.
- If you're invited, attend an interview/assessment.

Did you know you can apply to get an early offer from the Con before you get your ATAR? If you've got the talent and the dedication, we want you.

The degrees available under the admissions scheme are:

- Bachelor of Music
- Bachelor of Music (Composition)
- Bachelor of Music (Performance)

If you are a current HSC student in NSW, you must do the following:

- Apply to UAC by the audition registration closing date.
- List your chosen music degree as your first preference - one of the applicable degrees listed above.
- Apply directly to the Conservatorium for an audition/portfolio submission for a July or September audition.

The round you select for your audition/interview has no bearing on your CASAS eligibility, nor how you will be assessed. However, the advantage of choosing the July round is that you will have completed the process well before the HSC is underway.

Submit Portfolio by 14 August

Did you know you can apply to get an early offer from Sydney College of the Arts before you get your ATAR?

If you've got the talent and the dedication, we want you.

If you are an HSC student in NSW, you must do the following:

- apply to UAC and submit your portfolio by Thursday 14 August 2025, 11:59 pm AEDT.
- list your BVA as your highest eligible preference

For most NSW Year 12 HSC students, no separate application is required, and your Year 11 and 12 results and predicted ATAR will be obtained automatically through UAC by the Sydney College of the Arts.

You will be assessed on your portfolio, plus your academic results from years 11 and 12 so far. Predicted ATAR scores will be obtained by Sydney College of the Arts through UAC for students sitting the HSC or must be submitted directly if you are an interstate applicant.
